TRANSFER GUIDE FOR LAKELAND COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Lake Erie College welcomes students from Lakeland Community College who wish to obtain a bachelor's degree in their chosen field of study. Lake Erie College offers 23 different undergraduate majors and two graduate areas of study. In many cases, students who have completed an associate's degree can complete the requirements for a bachelor's degree with approximately two additional years of full-time coursework at Lake Erie College. With our generous transfer policy, students find transferring to Lake Erie College a smooth process. The college may accept up to 64 semester hours of credit from any one, or a combination of 2-year colleges. If a student has attended a 2-year and a 4-year college or university, a maximum of 96 semester hours may be transferred in.

THE TRANSFER PROCESS

- 1.) Submit the Lake Erie College Transfer Student Application along with the \$25.00 application fee.
- 2.) Contact all colleges you have attended and request that official academic transcripts be sent to the Office of Admissions.
- 3.) Submit the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) to the federal government. Lake Erie College's Title-IV code is 003066. Your information will be forwarded to Lake Erie College from the Department of Education. If you have already completed the FAFSA for another college but did not include Lake Erie College, you may submit a copy of your SAR (Student Aid Report) that you received from the government.*
- 4.) Contact the financial aid office(s) at all colleges you have attended and request that financial aid transcripts be sent to Lake Erie College, even if you did not receive financial aid. (This applies to spring semester transfers only.)*
- 5.) Submit a copy of your high school diploma or transcript.

*If you are not applying for financial aid, or will be enrolled less than half-time (fewer than 6 credit hours), you do not need to complete this step.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS ABOUT TRANSFERRING TO LAKE ERIE COLLEGE

Q Is Lake Erie College accredited?

A Yes. The North Central Association of Colleges and Universities and the Ohio Board of Regents accredit all of Lake Erie College's academic programs.

Q When should I apply to Lake Erie College?

A Lake Erie College admits students under a rolling admissions policy, so you may apply anytime before the start of a semester. The Fall semester usually starts the last week of August and the Spring semester starts approximately the second week of January. If you wish to be given priority consideration for financial aid and scholarships, it is recommended that you submit all application materials to the Admissions Office by February 15 for the following Fall semester.

Q Will all of my courses transfer?

A A total of 64 semester hours (or 96 quarter hours) may be transferred from a community college. Classes in which you have received a grade of "C" or better generally will transfer. However, remedial courses that are below the "100" level will not transfer. Consult with the Lake Erie College transfer counselor to confirm the transferability of classes.

Q Is financial aid available to transfer students?

A Yes. Lake Erie College awards scholarships and grants to transfer students based on the cumulative GPA from the last college attended. Students are encouraged to file the FAFSA form so that additional financial assistance, such as student loans, grants or work-study can be determined. Q Can I get credit for work experience?

A Yes. Lake Erie College has several ways of assessing credit for prior college-level learning. This includes assessment of credit through the development of a prior learning portfolio, CLEP examinations and training courses that have been reviewed by the American Council on Education. Q How long will it take me to finish?

A This depends upon your area of study at Lakeland Community College and what major you plan to pursue at Lake Erie College. However, many students are able to complete their bachelor's degree with only two more years of study, if they have completed an associate's degree. Please consult the Lake Erie College transfer counselor for more information. The transfer counselor is available for appointments at both Lakeland Community College and Lake Erie College.

Q I work full-time; can I still complete my degree at Lake Erie College?

A Yes. With Lake Erie College's L.E.A.P. (Lake Erie Alternative Program) program, Business Administration and Accounting students who work full-time can take classes on evenings and weekends. There are also many evening classes in all of the subject areas offered to accommodate our non-traditional students.
